***Student Health Insurance** is required annually of all full-time, undergraduate students. The annual premium is billed to the student's account for their first full-time quarter of attendance ... typically fall quarter. Students who can demonstrate that they are covered by a comparable plan may submit a request to have the SU insurance charge waived. Waiver requests must be submitted each new academic year before the end of the add-drop period for their first full-time quarter (October 1 for Fall Quarter 2013) to have the student health insurance fee taken off their student account.
